2025 Visa Requirements for Baycurrent Classic

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

In order to obtain an Entertainer Visa for Japan, you must first apply for a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE).

Missing this step will result in not being able to travel to Japan for the Baycurrent Classic.

You cannot apply for a visa without this document.

Step 1: Apply for Your Certificate of Eligibility (CoE)

CoEs take several weeks to process and will not be accepted at the time of visa processing. Even if you are only slightly considering going to Japan, we strongly encourage you to complete this step ASAP. There is no cost to apply for the Certificate of Eligibility.

Deadline to Submit: End of Day Thursday, August 7th

Who Needs a to apply?

Required: Players & Caddies need a visa regardless of nationality, unless they are Japanese citizens. Not required: Family, Staff, & Player Support, unless your nationality requires a tourist (short-term stay) visa. Check Japan's visa exemptions here: https://www.mofa.go.jp/j_info/visit/visa/short/novisa.html. If your country is not listed as an exemption, please contact Danyelle at Danyelle@DashPPV.com.

You will be asked to upload the following as separate high-quality images:

- 1. A clear headshot photo (white background, no hats or glasses); Prior photos cannot be used.
- 2. A clear photo of your passport (no fingers in the image)
- 3. A clear photo of your U.S. driver's license or state ID (if applicable)

Passport Requirements:

- 1. Has at least 5 blank VISA pages (this does not include amendment pages). Please consider any international upcoming travel that may take up visa pages.
- 2. Expires AFTER May 1, 2026

If your U.S. Passport does not meet these requirements, or if you would like to apply for a secondary US Passport, please contact Danyelle at <u>Danyelle@DashPPV.com</u> ASAP.

If you will be traveling in September and have a U.S. passport, contact Danyelle immediately about obtaining a second valid passport, as the passports may not be returned until Sanderson Farms Championship.

What Happens Next?

Detailed visa processing instructions will be shared in September. The CoE process is only Step 1. In September, you'll be required to submit your passport and additional documents to complete the visa process. Passports will be collected on-site at the Procore Championship in Napa. Those not playing in the tournament will receive separate instructions to mail in the documentation.

Additional Visa Processing Notes

- If you are entering the U.S. on a B1/B2 visa or an ESTA, you must apply for your visa from your home country. Instructions will be sent on how to obtain your Certificate of Eligibility to apply for your visa.
- At the time of visa processing, if you hold a P-1 visa and have multiple valid passports, you will not need to submit the passport containing your P-1 visa if the passport you submit meets all the requirements listed above.
- For non-U.S. Passport holders, if you need your passport to travel domestically, we strongly encourage you to get Global Entry (if your country qualifies) or obtain a U.S. Driver's License/State ID.
