NEED TO KNOW

- **PLAYER & CADDIE REGISTRATION** must be completed before practice or play. Registration is located at the South end of the clubhouse next to Player Dining. Hours of operation are listed above.
- **GROUNDS TICKETS** will be provided complimentary to players and caddies. Ticket requests can be done through the host organization tournament office and will be available at Will Call. NOTE: The host organization tournament office is located in the trailer behind hole #18 green (trailer is in the parking lot).
- **LOCKER ROOM** will be provided to each player in the field. The Men’s Locker Room is located at the North end of the clubhouse closest to the practice facilities. NOTE: Please be aware the lockers will not lock, but the room will be locked overnight daily. The locker room does have showers and shoe cleaning is available.

- **CLUB STORAGE** Golf bags are permitted to stay overnight in the Men’s Locker Room beginning Monday, May 25. The room will be locked overnight and open daily from 5:00 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.
- **EQUIPMENT DISTRIBUTION** will be in the Men’s Locker Room.
- **PHYSICAL THERAPY | CHIROPRACTOR** will be located inside the clubhouse in the Men’s Locker Room (PT) and the Women’s Locker Room (Chiropractor). Hours of operation are listed above.
- **FITNESS TRAILER** will be located in the club parking lot behind #18 green and adjacent to the host organization tournament office trailer.
- **PLAYER PARKING** is in the clubhouse parking lot. Limited parking is available. Players are encouraged to carpool as much as possible. NOTE: Player family/friends will **not** be permitted into the clubhouse parking lot regardless of credential. On Monday-Wednesday, family may use Caddie Parking and shuttle (listed below). On Thursday-Sunday, family should use the Public Parking and shuttle.
- **PLAYER DINING** will be located at the South end of the clubhouse in the Ball Room. Please refer to the tournament page on pgatourcentral.com for player dining menu’s during the week. Player dining will only be open to players, people with a “3” on a TOUR issued credential and player’s children aged 5 and under (please note hours of operation listed above). NOTE: No to-go containers will be provided, meals must be eaten inside the Player Dining area. Additional food and beverage for family/friends without a TOUR issued “3” credential will be available for purchase inside the clubhouse at the Center Bar/Donald Ross Lounge from 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. on Monday-Wednesday, and outside at the pool and on-course concessions on Thursday-Sunday.
- **CADDIE PARKING** is located at Worthdale Park (approximately 1 mile away). Please only use the Sunnybrook Road entrance to the park as GPS will not provide the proper entrance etc (please note the map entrance depicted below). Shuttle times are as follows:

- **CADDIE AREA & DINING** is located in a climate controlled tent located next to the driving range.
- **YARDAGE BOOKS** will be provided complimentary to all players and caddies at registration. Players and caddies **MUST** use a Rules Committee Approved Book since January 1, 2022.
- **PRACTICE ROUNDS** beginning on hole #10 must yield in all instances to players making the turn and must not delay practice rounds at any time. Abuse of the Practice Area Policy may result in disciplinary action.
- **OFFICIAL PRO-AM** will take place on Wednesday, May 27 as a 9&9 format with starting times from approximately 7:00 a.m. – 9:12 a.m. and 12:35 p.m. – 2:47 p.m. There will be approximately 52 teams. 9-hole practice rounds will be available prior to the Pro-Am only (practice rounds must not interfere with the Pro-Am pace of play). Please see below for practice facility restrictions during this Official Pro-Am.
- **WELLNESS CENTER** is available off-site for players ONLY. Located at the Knightdale and Raleigh campuses (at REX Hospital). Address is listed below for both campuses. Players must present a TOUR issued credential for entry. Upon first entry you will be asked to complete a registration/waiver form. Hours of Operation are as follows:

AGRONOMY

Raleigh Country Club features an excellent Donald Ross design that will present a fine competitive test with undulating bentgrass greens and formidable bunkering. The greens possess excellent putting quality and can firm up quickly with dry weather. The bermudagrass tees and fairways are in acceptable condition with a few isolated areas of sod where winterkill occurred. The rough density will largely depend on timely rains and warm temperatures leading up to the competition. Additionally, the course has several barrancas and peripheral bermudagrass areas that were mowed at 4.0" during advance week, and taller fescue areas that have developed seedheads.

Quick Facts:

- The target green speed will be 13.0 feet.
- The tees, fairways, and approaches will be mowed at 0.400 inch. The intermediate rough will be mowed at 1.5 inches, and the primary rough will have a final mow at 3.0 inches during advance week (if warranted).
