Today – Isolated to scattered shower/t-storm redevelopment remains possible in the area this afternoon/evening, highest chances after 5pm. Overnight, expect a chance of showers/t-storms to remain with a frontal boundary draped across southwest Missouri. T-storms will be capable of locally heavy rainfall. Winds will be light and variable for the rest of the day. Briefly variable/gusty winds are possible around thunderstorms. Highs reach near 83F this afternoon.

Rainfall through 2pm: 0.48". Additional Rainfall through tonight: 0.20-0.50", locally 1" with storms.

Extended forecast – Friday, with a lingering front near the area a chance of a few scattered showers/t-storms remains, highest chances in the morning to early afternoon. Locally heavy rainfall will remain possible with any thunderstorms. Winds will be light from the south. Over the weekend, a drier and warmer trend is expected as the main zone of shower/storm activity is expected to shift more across central/northern Missouri. This activity will still need to be monitored for Saturday, as a slight chance of activity could still build further south closer to Springfield. S/SW breezes develop for the weekend, with gusts to 15-18 mph.
